- 3. A 50-75 page double-spaced paper that includes a detailed description of the changes that occurred in mental health services from 1945 present.
- 4. A 2-3 page Executive Summary.
- 5. Five 1 page fact sheets summarizing major points on the following topics:
 - a. Summary of major facts
 - b. Changes in policy
 - c. Changes in mental health practice
 - d. Changes in facilities
 - e. Changes in funding
- 6. A 10-12 page article for the <u>Oregon Historical Quarterly</u> or other appropriate publication.
