III At 1815 on 9-17-06 the nursing staff was called to the booking area to evaluate the inmate. Deputy Hubbard initially said "I don't think he's breathing." over the intercom system. As Sokunthy Eath and I arrived in the booking area about 30 seconds later Deputy Hubbard said "No, he's breathing now."

Observed inmate through the glass window of the sep cell in the booking area. He was on the floor on his right side. A white spit sock was secured over his head. The sock was stained with at least a couple of red stains appearing to be blood. As I observed the inmate began seizure like activity, lasting approximately 5 seconds. It consisted of a

stiffening of his entire body and shaking and twitching of the extremities. When this activity subsided, the inmate was breathing and moving his head and limbs. Simultaneously while observing this activity the corrections staff was advised that we could not accept this inmate and that he should be taken to the hospital for evaluation. The arresting officer stated that this inmate was seen by "medical" before he was brought in and was deemed stable enough to bring to jail. "I'm just doing what I was told" said the officer.

The matter was then turned over to the corrections staff lead by Sgt. Martinez to arrange for inmate Chasse to be transported to the hospital. At about 2015, the nurses were notified that Inmate Chasse died on his way to the hospital.

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
